Lori became part of the staff team after working for the Sioux Falls School District for


17 years. Her grounding in education has been invaluable as she has helped update department information, standardize procedures, and handle the Pillar III courses.

Education

Medical Education Curriculum

Pillar I Educational Activities

Students are introduced to the study of obstetrics and gynecology during their first year in medical school and both topics are a fundamental aspect of medical students' Pillar I education.

Basic elements of the practice are introduced through clinical foundations and medical foundations courses. In addition, the field is studied in depth during the endocrine and reproduction course.

Pillar II Educational Activities

Ob/Gyn is also fully integrated into USD SSOM's Longitudinal Integrated Clerkship (LIC) used through Pillar II. Students gain clinical experience while maintaining time for shadowing, studying for exams, and didactic lessons. The LIC approach has been shown to increase Step 2 test scores and provide an integrated approach to medicine.

General

- Students rotate through several core specialties throughout Pillar Il to maintain their skills and understanding as they prepare for their exams
- Each week includes rotations in these core specialties: Peds, IM, Ob/ Gyn, General Surgery, Psychiatry, Neurology, and Family Medicine

Ob/Gyn Clerkship

- Ob/Gyn rotations (pink) include both clinical and OR experiences
- Schedules are built so students can meet patients in clinic and follow up with related surgery when necessary

Ob/Gyn ICE Weeks and Call Shifts

- In addition to their usual rotations students also participate in call shifts and intensive Inpatient Clinical Experience (ICE) weeks
- Call shifts include overnight and 24-hours shifts designed to show the many aspects involved in a career in Ob/Gyn
- ICE weeks present students the full spectrum of Obstetric & Gynecologic conditions. They take H&Ps, participate in the OR, and work on the Labor & Delivery Ward under the supervision of their attending clinician.

Pillar III Educational Activities







Medical Education Update

Sixty-six students were enrolled at the completion of the 2nd semester. The CO2023 is the first Pillar 2 LIC class to move under the new two-semester grading system. Numerous components of the Pillar 2 clerkships and competencies grades were changed as a result, as well as changes to the NBME and overall grading scale to improve scoring sensitivity. Readers should be cautious of direct correlations between the current class and previous classes due to these changes. The report contains grade results for the clerkships, competencies, and the 1-credit courses.

The clerkship's overall grade averages were slightly lower than in previous years but no areas approaching significance. There was an increase in the number of students earning B's but this was expected as part of the curricular and grading scale changes to increase grade differentiation. The CO2023 also had an increase in the number of "D" letter grades (n=8) compared to CO2022 (n=0). Consequently, there was a rise in the number of students (n = 7) being referred to the Student Progress and Conduct Committee, mainly due to not achieving a passing score on their NBME exams). Competency grades were similar compared to previous classes with no areas of concern. The grades reflected in this report do not contain remediated course grade data.

In general, there were no significant issues related to the curriculum changes that adversely impacted student performance for CO2023. The Office of Medical Education will continue to monitor the implemented changes for future classes.
