How does a child who was both a victim and survivor of the Cambodian genocide grow to become an internationally recognized human rights leader? Genocide Survivor and International Human Rights Activist Arn Chorn Pond is the subject of the documentary *The Flute Player* and a founder of Children of War -- an international youth leadership organization for building community, activism, and healing for teenagers.. Because the Khmer Rouge had massacred most of a generation's artists and musicians, Arn is teaching a new generation of Cambodians (both in the US and in Cambodia) about their traditional music and art forms.
