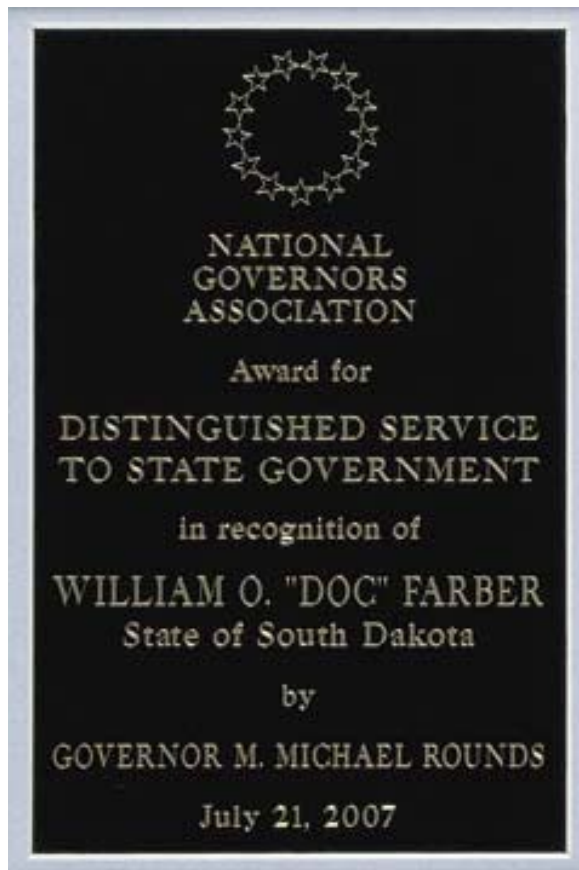

DAKOTA DAY IS COMING-OCTOBER 13th

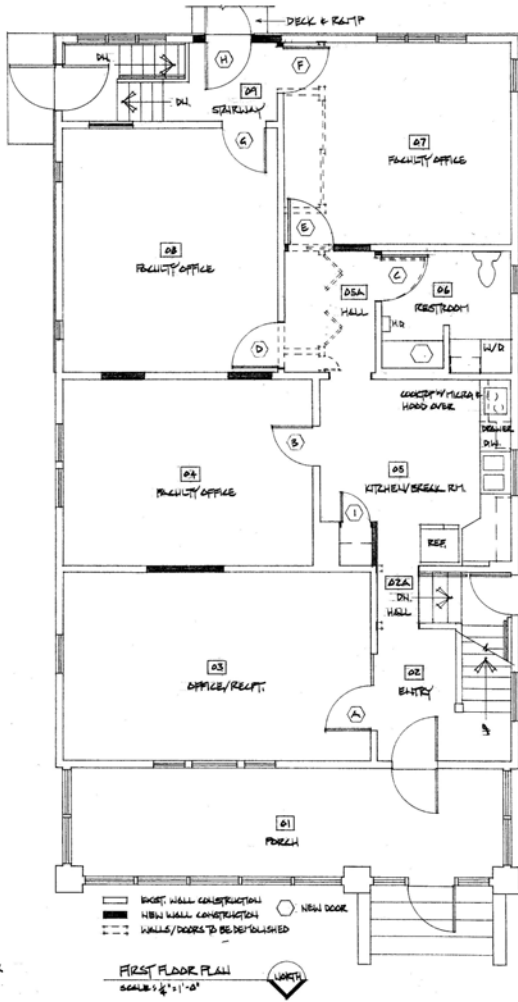

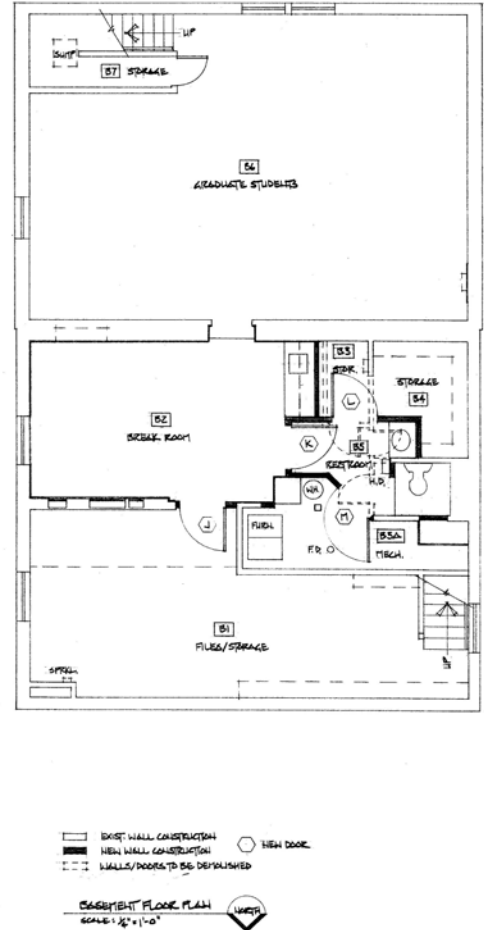

Nominating Committee Recommendations: Joel Glover, Douglas “Joe” Moeller, and Tim Oviatt have each completed two-year terms as members of the Administrative Committee and are rotating off the AC at this time. As authorized by the bylaws, the Farber Fund Nominating Committee has recommended that **Julie Johnson, Dusty Johnson, and Stephen Wilson** each be elected to two year terms to fill these three vacant positions. Furthermore, because our current Chair, **Dick Brown**, is also the Executor of Doc’s estate, it is recommended that Dick be elected to a two-year term as Chair-elect so that he continues to retain an official position with the Fund as he negotiates with the Foundation, U. and other entities on behalf of the Farber Fund and estate. Newly-returned Iraqi veteran **Ken Tauke** will assume the Chair position at the conclusion of the October 12th meeting. Current Administrative Committee members Mike Koehler, Drake Olson, and Jamie Rounds each have one-year remaining in their current terms.

Doc’s Enduring Legacy—Doc gave of himself so readily and easily during his long association with USD. Students—especially students—colleagues, friends, and all manner of public servants remember well how often and thoroughly he touched various lives. I suspect it will surprise none of you that Doc chose to give the vast bulk of his estate to the U. that he loved so that future students, faculty and staff could continue to have their lives affected by this remarkable man. In addition to Farber House and a new Farber Futures Fund, his gift to the U. also includes an extensive archive of his personal papers and books as well as his eclectic collection of valuable art works. As use and display agreements are negotiated with I.D. Weeks Library, University Art Galleries, and the National Music Museum, we will update you about how these other gifts will be made available to interested parties.

YOUR CONTRIBUTIONS

With the addition of donations from Doc’s estate, there is a new Farber Fund that has been established in accordance with Doc’s wishes. Your Farber Fund contributions now can be dedicated according to your preferences for the uses authorized by our Bylaws and the Executive Board.

Farber Fund No. 1 is the original fund that is used for student travel and internships.

Farber Fund No. 2 is used for scholarships, student-faculty research, and special projects as donors may request.

Farber Fund No. 3 is an endowment for scholarships that was established as a result of the July 8, 2000 fundraiser.

Farber Fund No. 4 is the new “**Farber Futures**” endowment that will support POLS student organizations, faculty and student involvement in community outreach activities, the research of the Government Research Bureau, and Farber House. (The annual payout from contributions to the Futures Fund is evenly divided among the four intended purposes.)
