The American Economy: Front and Center on the Global Stage. In his time at the SEC, Christopher Cox worked to ensure that the international regulatory atmosphere was conducive to the free market economy that keeps America and the world moving forward. With the global economy in uncharted waters, Cox explains the signs coming from the markets and decodes the signals coming out of Washington. With experience both as a long-standing leader in Congress and as the chair of the SEC, he understands the complex push and pull that determines the nature of the regulatory environment, the financial markets, and the success of American business around the world.

Christopher Cox was the 28th chair of the Securities and Exchange Commission, where he brought ground-breaking cases against a variety of market abuses. From 1986 to 1988, Cox served in the White House as senior associate counsel to the president. For 10 of his 17 years in Congress, Cox served in the majority leadership of the U.S. House of Representatives and was chair of many committees, including House Policy, Homeland Security, U.S. National Security, the Task Force on Capital Markets and the Task Force on Budget Process Reform. Chairman Cox received an M.B.A. and a J.D. simultaneously from Harvard Law School, where he was an editor for the *Harvard Law Review*.
