

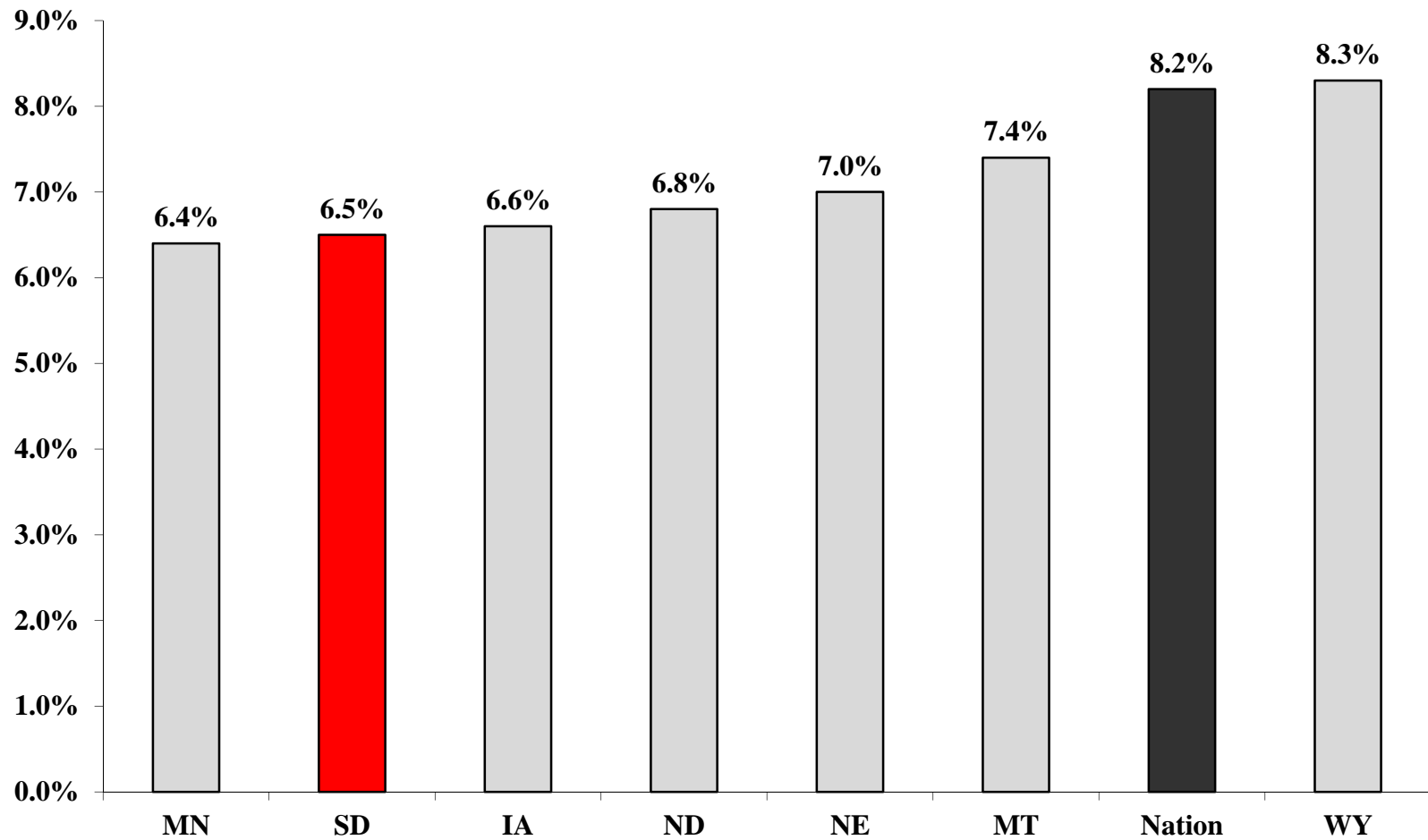

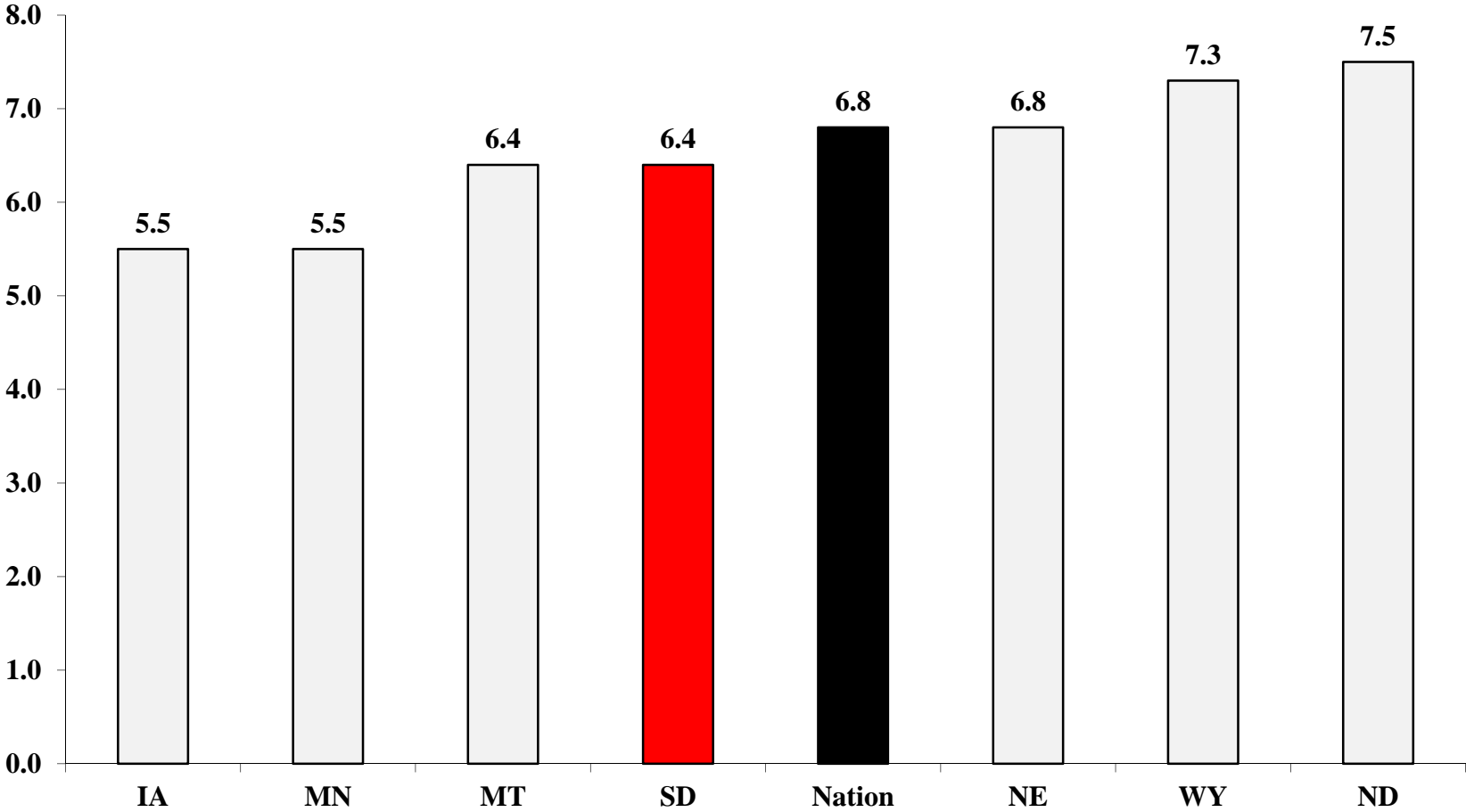

Percent for the South Dakota and bordering states, 2008



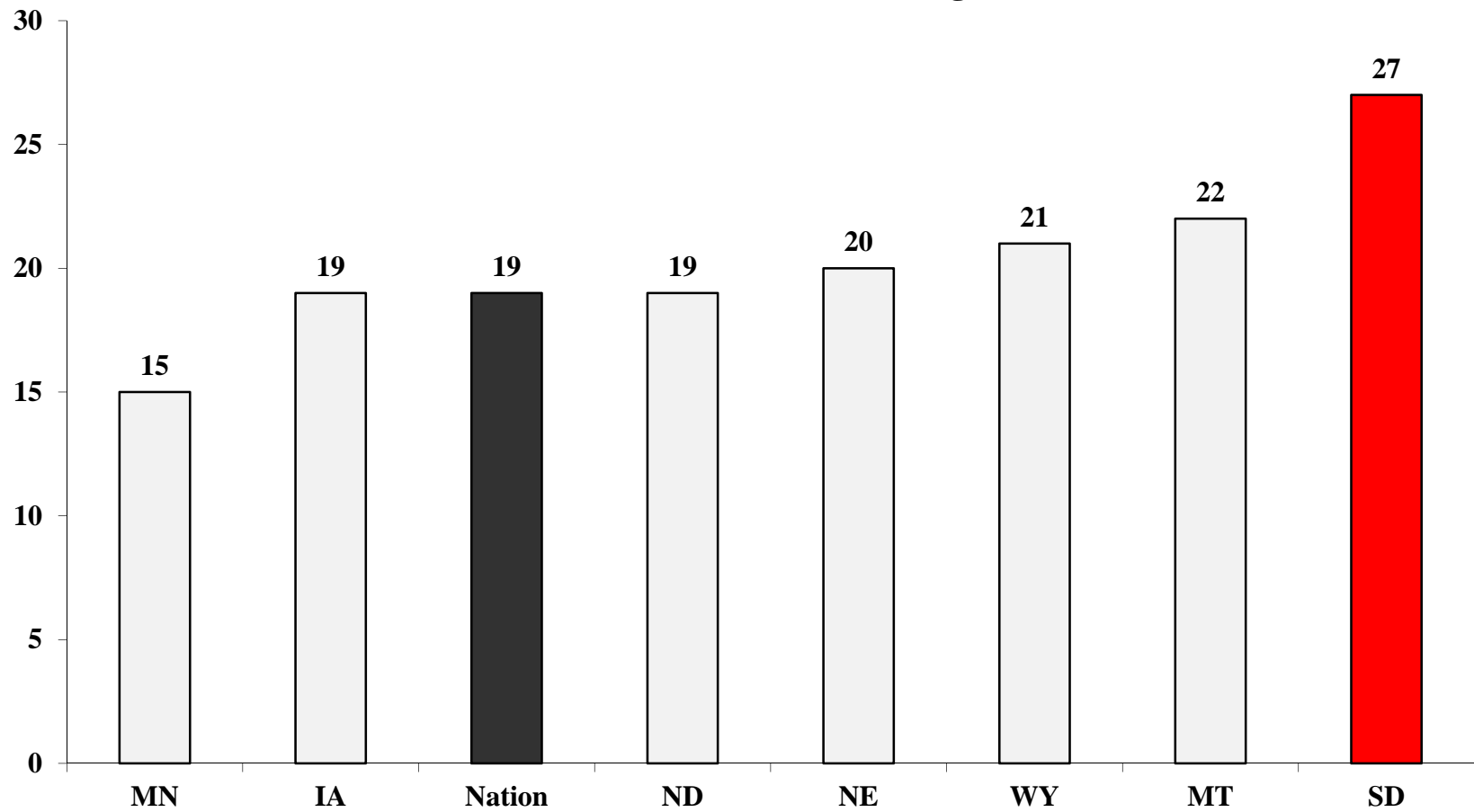

Rate for South Dakota and bordering states, 2007



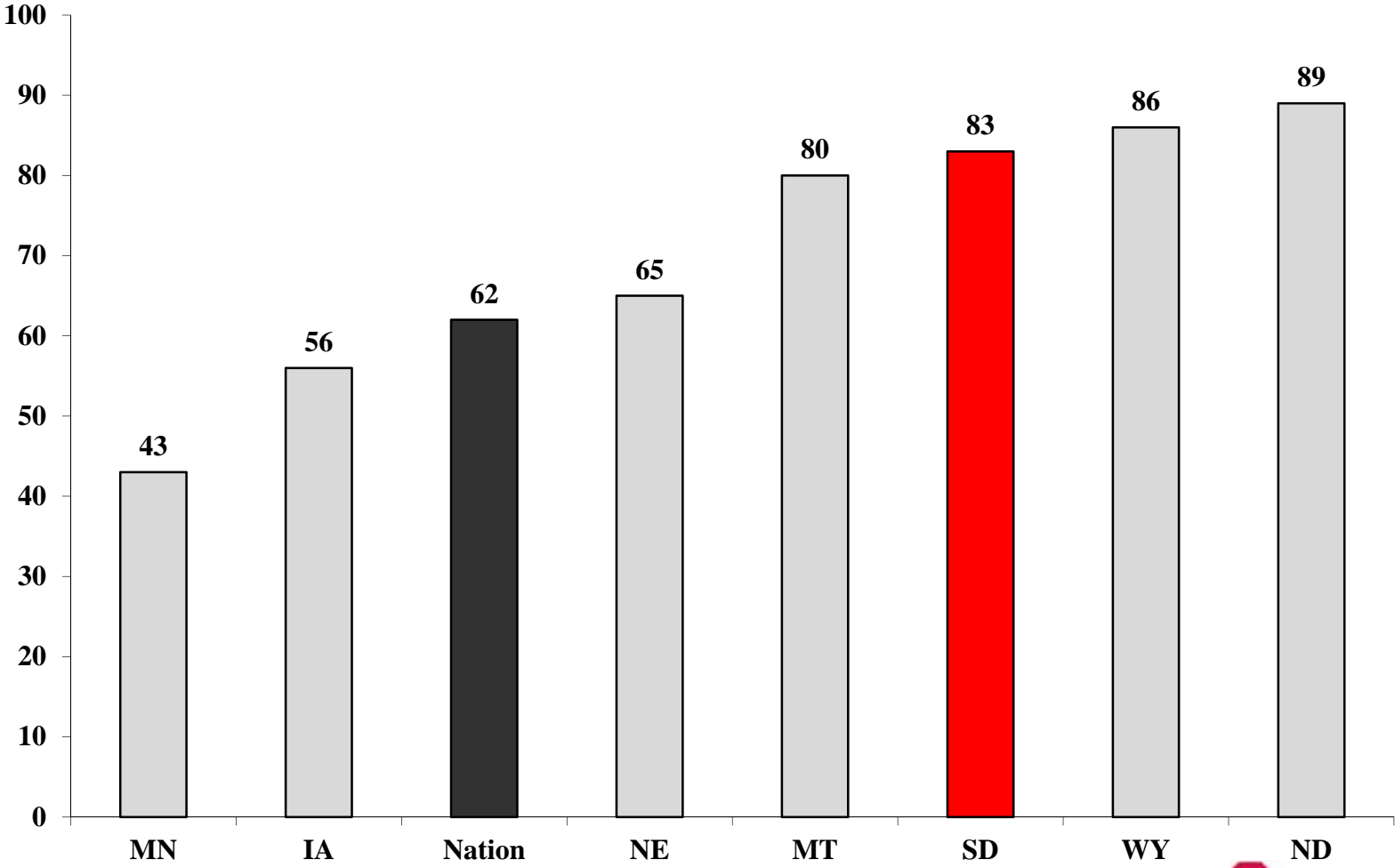

Rate for South Dakota and bordering states, 2007



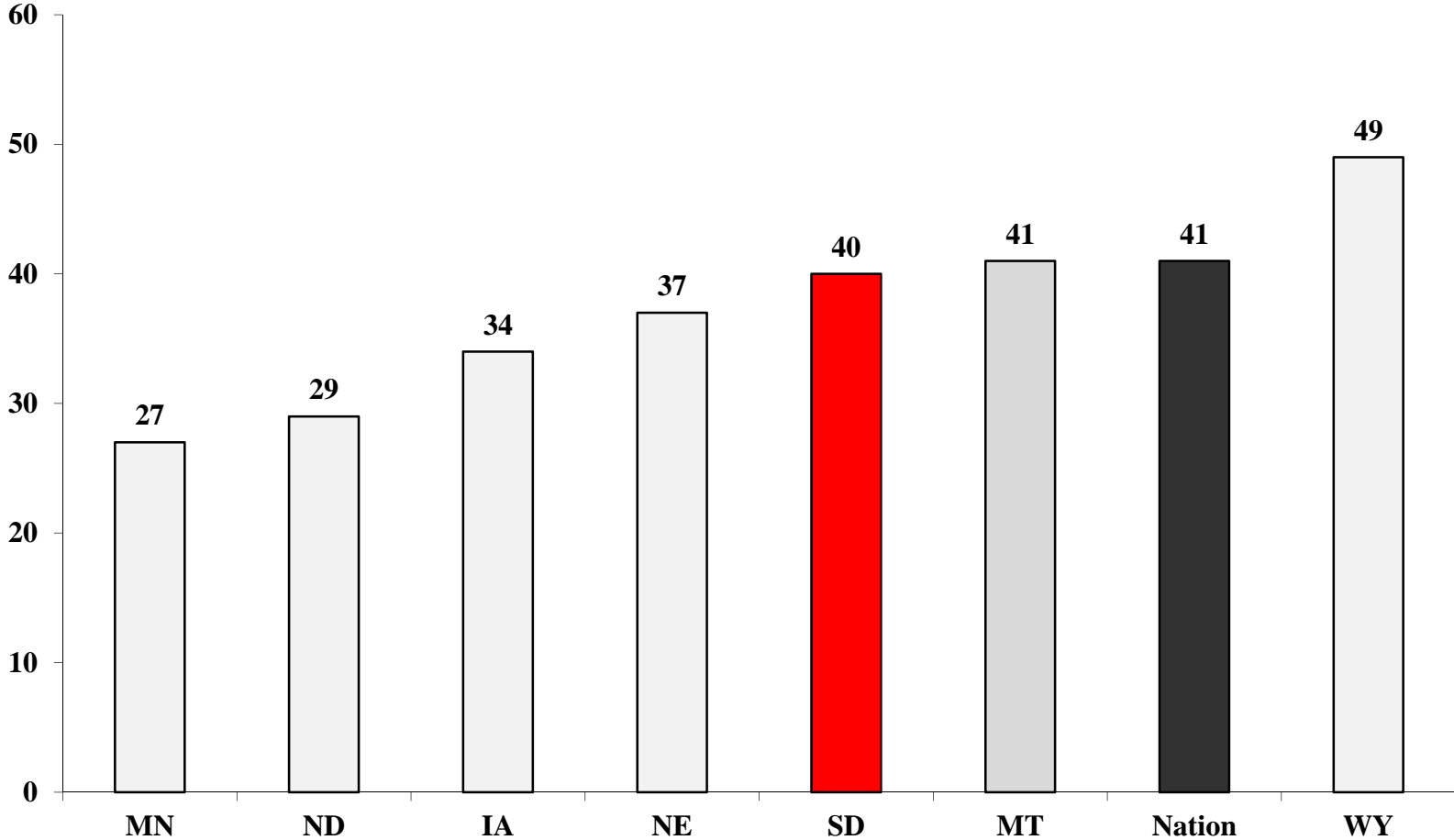

Rate for South Dakota and bordering states, 2007



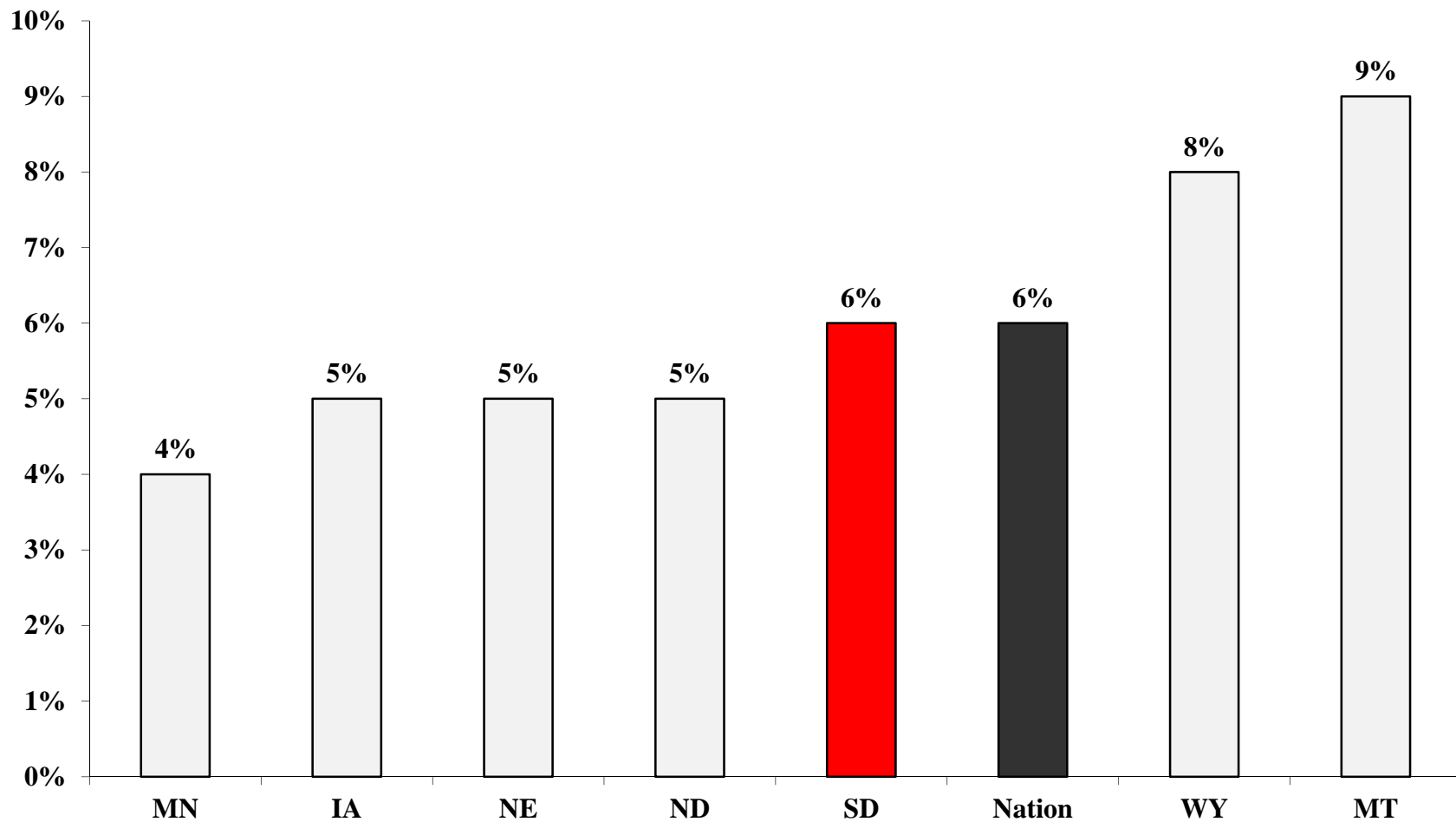

Rate for South Dakota and bordering states, 2008



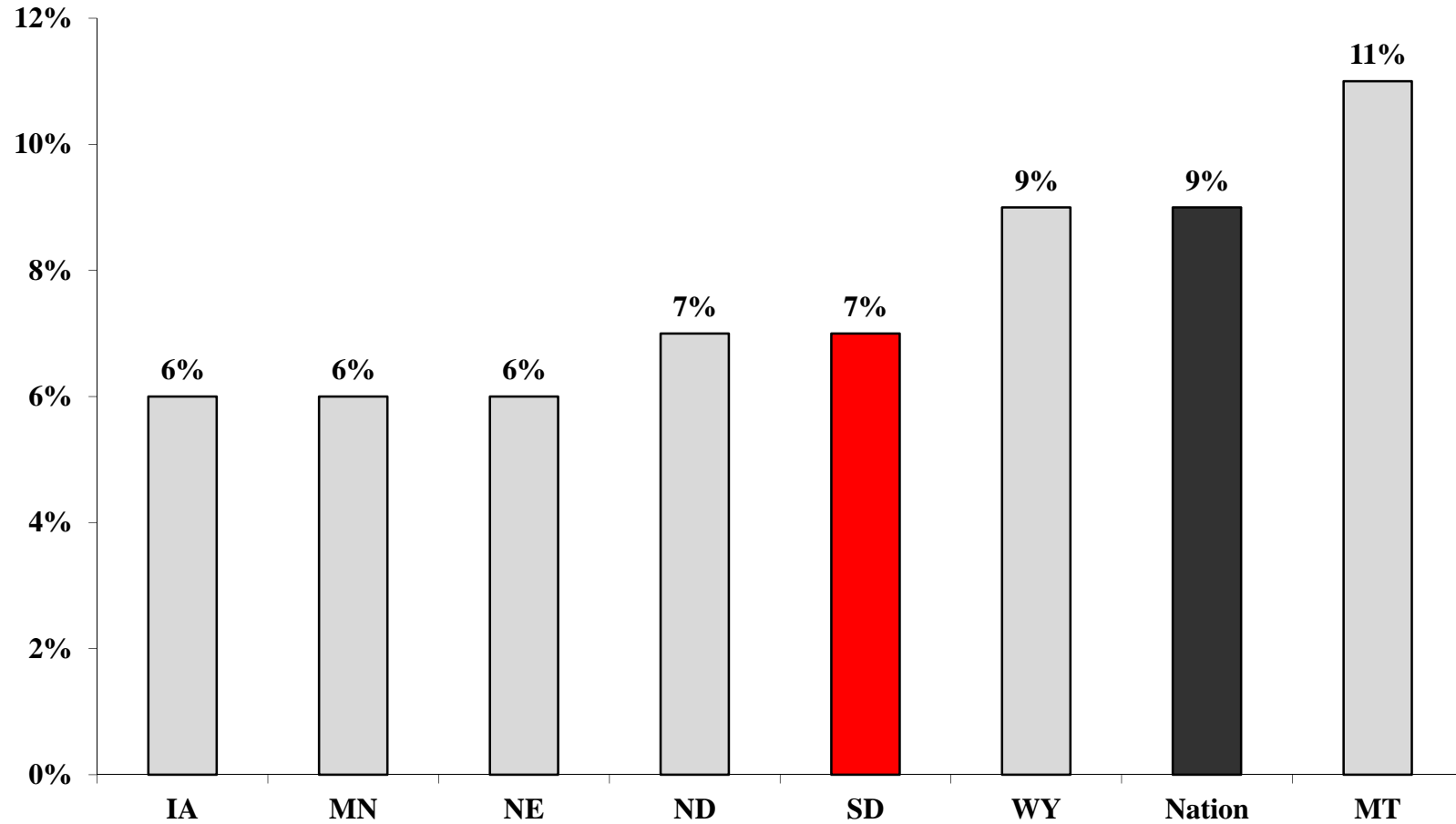

Teens Not in School and Not High School Graduates (ages 16-19) Percent for South Dakota and bordering states, 2009



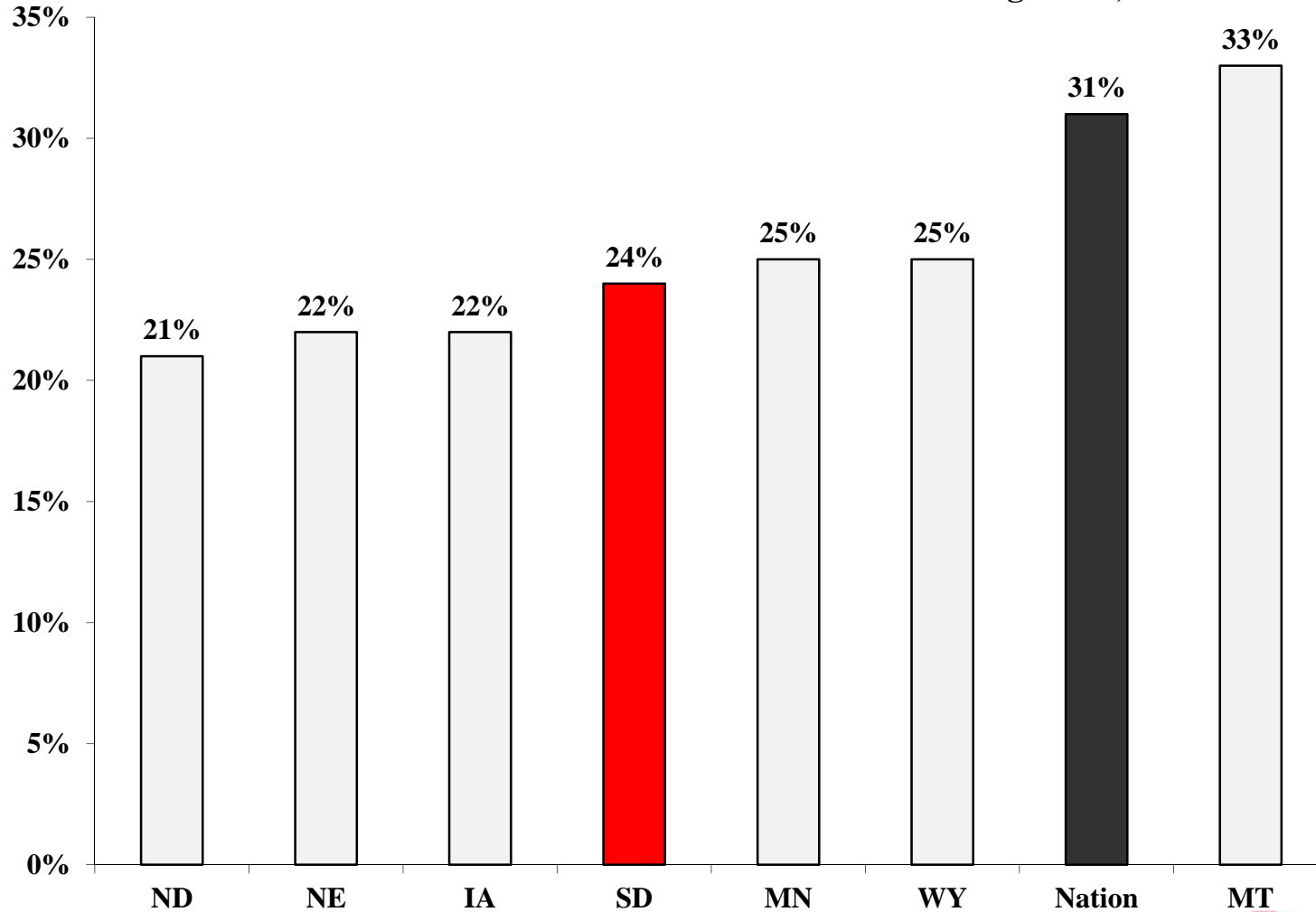

Percent for South Dakota and bordering states, 2009**



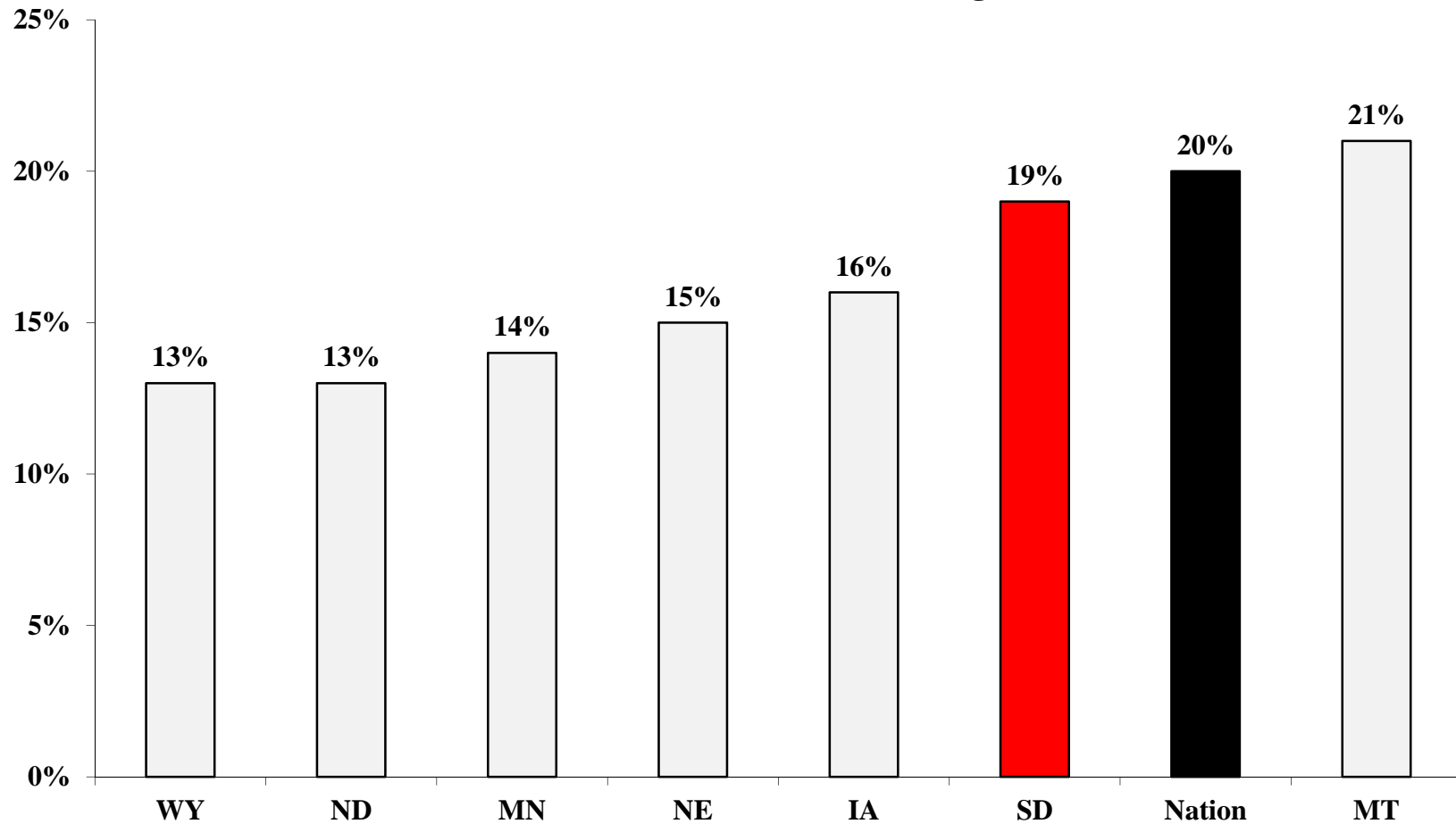

Children Living in Families Where no Parent has Full-time, Year-round Employment Percent for South Dakota and bordering states, 2009



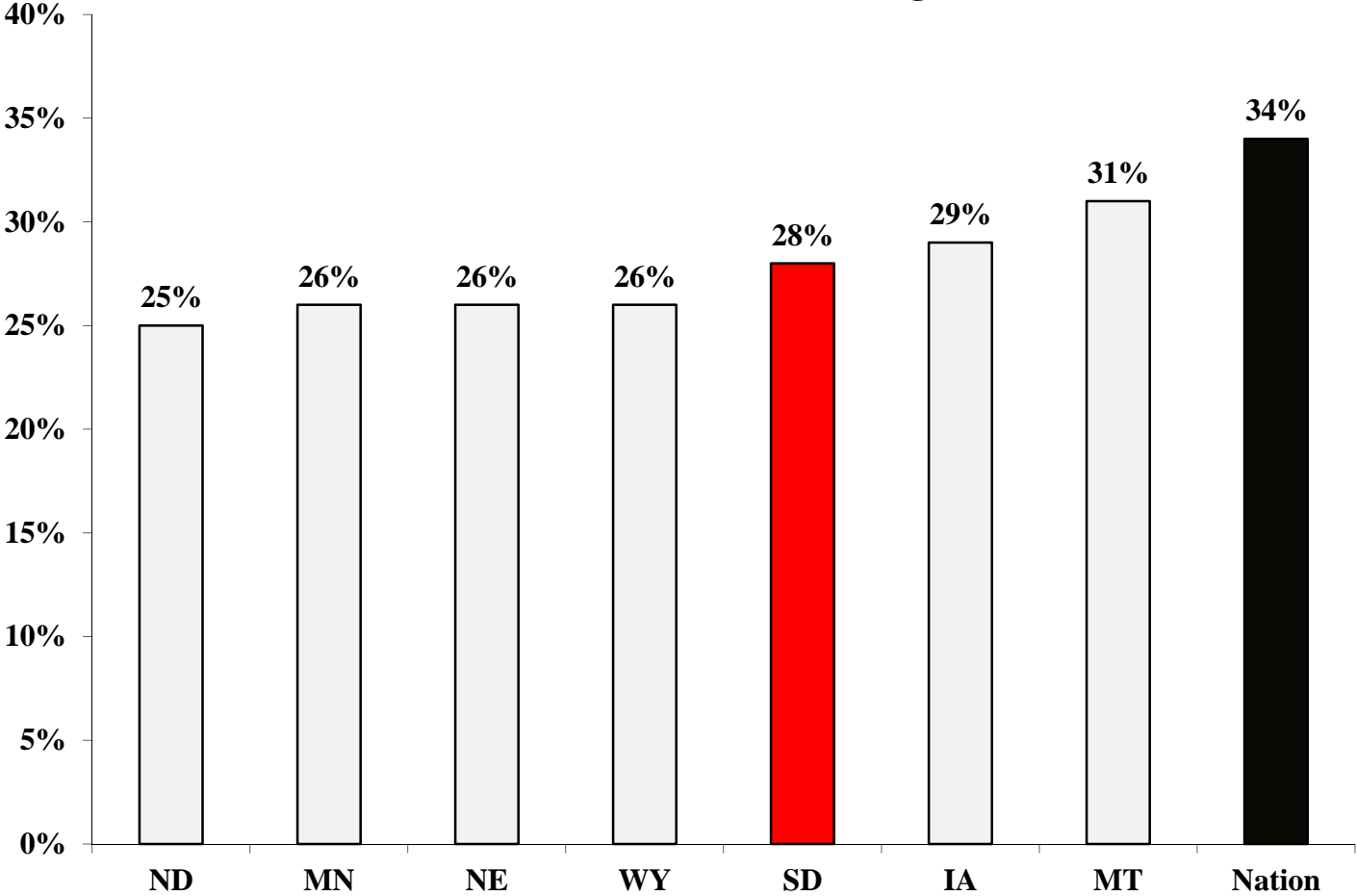
