Data for health indicators ([infant mortality](#), [low birth weight](#), [child deaths](#), [teen deaths](#), [births to single teens](#), and [prenatal care](#)) have been edited so you can easily toggle between the number and rate or percent. Data are for five year intervals 1993-97 through 2005-09.



Poverty data from the Small Area Income and Poverty Estimates have been added to the Data Center. The years available are 2003 through 2009. Poverty estimates for [Under age 18](#), [ages 5 to 17](#) are available for the state and all counties. Poverty estimates for [under age 5](#) are available for the state only.

Featured Data A Special Report-Facts on KIDS

In South Dakota, the teen death rate (ages 15-19 per 100,000) has been higher than the nation throughout the past decade.

In 2007, the national teen death rate stood at 62 deaths per 100,000 teens (13,299 teens)¹, compared to 83 deaths per 100,000 teens in South Dakota (48 teens).
