The goal of the Doctor of Education in Educational Administration degree with an emphasis in Adult and Higher Education is to develop professionals who can add substantially to the field with original and ongoing work as well as to perform effectively as practitioners on the job. This program reflects the implicit assumptions about the knowledge, skills, and philosophy of the field of study. Consistent with these assumptions, considerable evidence shows that learning is facilitated when the student/learner participates in the process of learning.

The Ed.D. in Educational Administration degree with an emphasis in Adult and Higher Education encourages the student/learner to be a participant in the process, to choose directions, make worthwhile contributions, and satisfactorily live with the consequences of one's choices. This educational climate of encouragement directly affects the program by providing stimulation and relevance to an individual's educational experience. The force behind this approach is the need to keep up with and expand knowledge for the benefit of all segments of society.

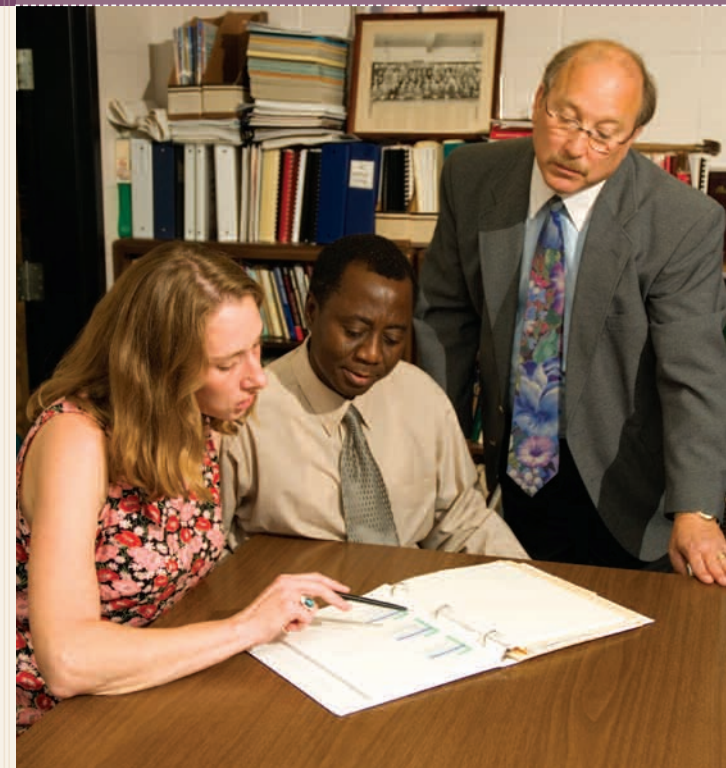

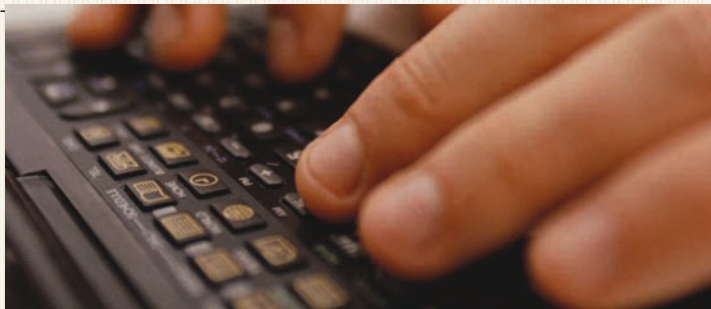
