The Educational Specialist (Ed.S.) in Educational Administration, Elementary School Principal program is designed as a post-master's degree for practicing teachers and/or administrators in the field. The conceptual framework for this innovative and exciting online degree prepares reflective leaders who are skilled educators whose practices and decisions draw upon the best available theory, research, and experiential wisdom.

Upon completion of the online Educational Administration degree, including the accompanying field-based internship, students also earn Elementary School Principal (Grades K-8) licensure. Students should contact their state for specific licensure requirements.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must meet the admission requirements of the Graduate School and specific requirements of the educational administration program. Graduate School requirements can be accessed online at www.usd.edu/grad.

To be eligible for the Educational Specialist degree in Educational Administration, applicants must:

- Possess a valid teaching certificate for licensure
- Possess a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution of higher learning and an undergraduate GPA of at least 2.7 (on a 4.0 scale) or its equivalent (2.5 for provisional admission)
- Possess a master's degree from a regionally accredited institution of higher learning and a graduate GPA of at least 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) or its equivalent
- GRE score = Full Admission: Minimum GRE Score of 150 Verbal and 140 Quantitative or above; Combined score of 290 or above. Or minimum MAT score: MAT 45 (scaled = 403) or above. Provisional Admission: Minimum GRE Score of 145 Verbal and 140 Quantitative or above; Combined score of 285 or above. Or minimum MAT Score: 35 (scaled = 388) or above.
- Provide official transcripts from all institutions of higher learning
- Provide three letters of recommendation
- Provide a Statement of Purpose

GETTING STARTED

Prospective graduate students may apply through the Graduate School at www.usd.edu/grad/how-to-apply.cfm

The Graduate School forwards completed application to the appropriate academic department for review. The department will then recommend the admission status of the applicant to the Dean of the Graduate School, who will make the final decision as to admission status. Students may be accepted to the University of South Dakota Graduate School with full admission or provisional admission.

Upon final decision of the Dean of the Graduate School, the Graduate School will notify in writing each applicant as to his/her admission status.

NON-DEGREE PURSUANT STATUS

To experience the University of South Dakota as a non-degree pursuant student, the University offers graduate students the option of learning under a non-degree pursuant classification. Up to nine credit hours earned as a non-degree pursuant student may be applied to a graduate degree from USD at the discretion of the academic department.
