

MASTER OF ARTS IN EDUCATIONAL ADMINISTRATION: SCHOOL DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT - ONLINE

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Master of Arts (M.A.) in Educational Administration, School District Superintendent program provides aspiring school leaders a combination of online courses and field experiences that draw upon the best available theory, research, and experiential wisdom. The coursework is offered online while the field-based internship is completed under the supervision of experienced school administrators. This provides a purposeful balance of academic preparation and field-based practical experience to produce an effective school administrator.

Upon completion of the online Educational Administration degree, including the accompanying field-based internship, students also earn School District Superintendent licensure. Students should contact their state for specific licensure requirements.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must meet the admission requirements of the Graduate School and specific requirements of the educational administration program. Graduate School requirements can be accessed online at www.usd.edu/grad.

To be eligible for the Master of Arts degree in Educational Administration, applicants must:

- Possess a valid teaching certificate for licensure
- Possess a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution of higher learning and an undergraduate GPA of at least 2.7 (on a 4.0 scale) or its equivalent (2.5 for provisional admission)
- GRE score = Full Admission: Minimum GRE Score of 150 Verbal and 140 Quantitative or above; Combined score of 290 or above. Or minimum MAT score: MAT 45 (scaled = 403) or above. Provisional Admission: Minimum GRE Score of 145 Verbal and 140 Quantitative or above; Combined score of 285 or above. Or minimum MAT Score: 35 (scaled = 388) or above.
- Provide official transcripts from all institutions of higher learning
- Provide three letters of recommendation
- Provide a Statement of Purpose

GETTING STARTED

Prospective graduate students may apply through the Graduate School at www.usd.edu/grad/how-to-apply.cfm.

The Graduate School forwards completed application to the appropriate academic department for review. The department will then recommend the admission status of the applicant to the Dean of the Graduate School, who will make the final decision on admission. Students may be accepted to the University of South Dakota Graduate School with full admission or provisional admission.

NON-DEGREE PURSUANT STATUS

To experience the University of South Dakota as a non-degree pursuant student, the University offers graduate students the option of learning under a non-degree pursuant classification. Up to nine credit hours earned as a non-degree pursuant student may be applied to a graduate degree from USD at the discretion of the academic department.
