A minimum of 33 hours of history, including HIST 121 and 122 OR HIST 111 and 112; 151; 152; 476; and 480. See schedule in catalogue. Major courses must be chosen to include a minimum of 9 hours of American History and 9 hours of non-American History.

Allied requirements: 12 hours in other social science areas including at least 6 hours in two (2) of the following: political science/criminal justice, psychology, geography, sociology/anthropology, and economics. A minor in a social science area may be achieved by taking an additional 12 hours beyond one of the Allied areas.

Note: Students must have an Academic Teaching Minor including a methods course. A methods course can not double count towards the hours required for both the major and the minor.

Minor- HISTORY – 18 hours divided between American and World History including HIST 476 , and SEED 415.

The bachelor's degree is also available through the College of Arts and Sciences. An additional 3 hours of history electives would be required for the A & S degree (SEED 415 would not count towards the major hours). All teacher certification requirements must be completed including passing scores on the PPST, Praxis content exam 10941 and the PLT. See a teacher education advisor in the School of Education Student Services for additional information.

As a professionally accredited unit, the USD School of Education limits the number of students admitted to the Teacher Education programs based on the availability of resources.
