MFL 420 is currently offered every other fall. Some upper level Spanish requirements may be satisfied during a semester of study abroad. Students should consult and advisor in the Spanish department.

A minimum of 38 hours of Spanish including SPAN 101, 102, 201, 202, 311, 312, 411, 412, 432 or 438; SPAN 450 or 480, MFL 420 and three hours of electives. Advanced placement students can purchase the credits for SPAN 101 and 102.

NOTE: Students must have an Academic Teaching Minor including a methods course.

Course credits may not be double counted as both major and minor credits.

*The B.A. degree is only available through the College of Arts and Sciences.
