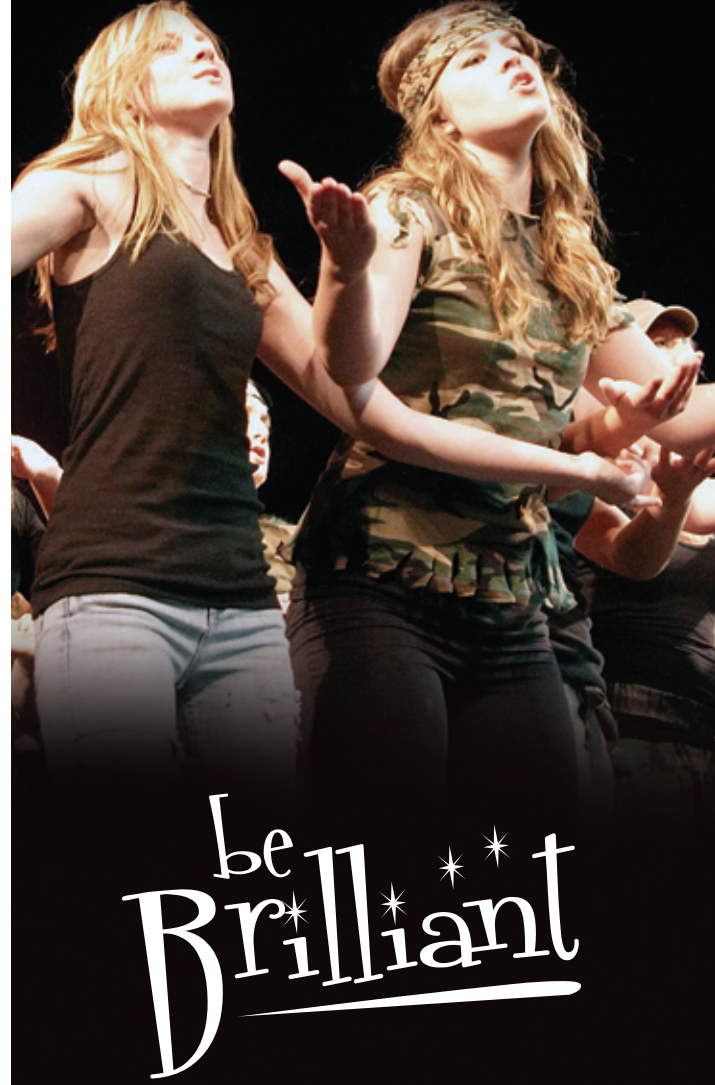

The mission of the South Dakota Ambassadors of Excellence Program is to provide an optimum learning experience for South Dakota's gifted high schoolers in a safe and supportive environment, emphasizing service, leadership, and artistic development.

The program is sponsored by the School of Education of The University of South Dakota and the South Dakota Department of Education, endorsed by the Honorable Mike Rounds, Governor of South Dakota.

The Ambassadors of Excellence Program is designed for selected former South Dakota Governor's Camp participants and other high school students who exhibit outstanding talent and leadership potential.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Food and Dormitory Lodging

Ambassadors will be lodged in the dormitory complex on the USD campus.

Team-Building Activities

Ambassadors will engage in team activities designed to build friendships, awareness and respect for individual differences, and leadership.

Educational Options

This year's ambassadors will have the option to choose from two tracks. The exploratory track allows students to experience six one-session classes in a variety of fields, while the focus track places them in two classes that meet in three consecutive 75-minute sessions over three days.



Evening Elective Activities

Examples: reading groups, chess and board games, open mic performance, outdoor recreation and sports, musical jam, drama improvisation, art room, ethics discussion/debate and "Ambassadors Night Live."

Service to Governor's Camp

Ambassadors work with students in the South Dakota Governor's Camp, serving as senior counselors, activity coordinators and mentors. Ambassadors help with the design and function of evening elective activities, performances and team-building competitions.

Twenty-first Annual South Dakota Ambassadors of Excellence Performance

As is the long tradition, the South Dakota Ambassadors of Excellence will perform in the Wayne S. Knudson Theatre, Warren M. Lee Center for the Fine Arts, Thursday, July 30, at 7 p.m. Parents, relatives and friends are encouraged to attend this free performance.

ELIGIBILITY & SELECTION

An ambassador must be a high-ability student entering the 10th, 11th, or 12th grade in fall of 2009 with a record of:

- demonstrated talent
- leadership
- active participation in school and community activities
- high academic success

Former South Dakota Governor's Camp participants and former ambassadors are encouraged to apply. Ambassadors will be role models of excellence for students at the South Dakota Governor's Camp. The acceptance or rejection decision by the director of the South Dakota Center for Education of the Gifted is final.

APPLICATION & REGISTRATION

Cost to the student is \$495. The application form and \$45 application fee (non-refundable if the student is selected for attendance) for The Ambassadors of Excellence Program must be received by June 15, 2009.

Students selected will be notified as soon as possible and final registration forms with classes and preliminary activity assignments will be mailed to them.

Early application is advised.

The remaining \$450 is to be paid prior to or upon arrival at USD on July 20. This cost will cover housing, food, insurance, recreation and instructional materials. Transportation is not included.

The formal opening of the program will begin at 3 p.m. July 20 in the Warren M. Lee Center for the Fine Arts. Closing of both camps will be on Friday, July 31 at 3 p.m.

Ambassadors are expected to abide by a very strict honor code. Adult supervision will be provided by the Center staff.
