Contestants may select audition materials from the following guidelines:

Two works of contrasting style from two of the four periods of music listed below:

BAROQUE
CLASSIC
ROMANTIC
CONTEMPORARY

Audition pieces should be performed from memory. Transcriptions, arrangements and popular music styles are not allowed.

Scholarship Awards:

Truran Scholarship winners will be selected on the basis of the audition performance, academic standards, and personal qualities. All incoming freshmen or transfer students majoring in music are eligible to compete. Awards range from \$500 to \$4,000 annually.
