VI. Rules of Conduct

Students enrolled in the University of South Dakota Summer University Program at The Indian University of North America at Crazy Horse Memorial have an important responsibility to reflect standards of conduct that are in harmony with the Crazy Horse community as a whole. To safeguard rights, opportunities, and welfare of students, faculty, staff and guests of Crazy Horse Memorial and to insure protection of the interest of Crazy Horse Memorial as it seeks to carry out its mission, these Rules of Conduct are hereby established.

A. Academic Success

To insure success in the Summer University Program students must wake up and go to work or class on time and complete the work assignments provided by each professor.

B. Honesty

No student should provide false information, incomplete, or misleading information to Crazy Horse Memorial with intent to defraud. Forgery, alteration and/or misuse of Crazy Horse documents, records, or identification, and the unauthorized use of signatures are likewise prohibited.

C. Respect for Crazy Horse staff and Summer University Program Faculty

1. Intentional obstruction of teaching, research, administration, disciplinary proceedings, or other Crazy Horse activities is prohibited.

2. Failure to comply with directions of a Crazy Horse Memorial official, including Dorm Directors, or willfully hindering such an official from acting in the performance of his or her duties is prohibited.
3. Failure to observe sanctions applied through the judicial process is prohibited.
4. Violation or disregard of published or posted regulations or policies of Crazy Horse Memorial are prohibited, including but not limited to:
 - Rights and responsibilities *Student Bill of Rights* and the *Roommate Bill of Rights*
 - Housing rules governing residence on Crazy Horse property.
 - Specific and unique Crazy Horse regulations, as stated in current official notices.
5. Student organizations are expected to abide by Crazy Horse Memorial regulations and policies at all on and off-campus sponsored events.

D. Respect for Facilities

1. Unauthorized entry, occupation, or use of Crazy Horse Memorial facilities is prohibited. Unauthorized use or possession of keys or key cards is also prohibited.
2. Destruction of Property or attempt to destroy property belonging to Crazy Horse Memorial or its residents, employees or guests is prohibited. Crazy Horse Memorial property includes buildings, equipment rented, leased, or otherwise placed on the campus by Crazy Horse Memorial, and also Crazy Horse-owned equipment not located on campus.

E. Respect for Others

The following actions or behavior committed against a student, staff, faculty member, or visitor are prohibited (Refer to policies on Work Place Harassment and Violence-Free Work Place on pages 12 and 13 of the Crazy Horse Memorial Employment Handbook for Seasonal Employees):

1. Abuse: An unwarranted verbal or written exchange including profane, insulting, or offensive language or behavior directed toward another person.

Racial, ethnic, or sexual comments that demean or defame are also prohibited.

2. Assault: Conduct that threatens or endangers the health or safety of another person.

3. Assault and Injury: An act intended to cause, and which does cause, injury to another person.

4. Any student behavior or activity that obstructs the right of free speech or expression of any person on campus is prohibited.

5. Harassment or Hazing: An act that intimidates, annoys alarms, embarrasses, ridicules, or produces psychological or physical discomfort.

6. Sexual Harassment: An attempt to coerce a person into a sexual relationship, or to subject a person to unwanted sexual attention or demands, or to punish or retaliate for refusal to comply with sexual demands.

7. Sexual Offenses: Any sexual act directed against another person, forcibly and/or against that person's will; or not forcibly or against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent.

8. Obscene Conduct: Any indecent exposure or action of an obscene, lewd, or indecent nature.

9. Disorderly Conduct: Any conduct, including but not limited to drunkenness, which disturbs the peace and tranquility of the campus. Excessive noise or public nuisance disruptive to Crazy Horse Memorial and surrounding neighborhoods is prohibited.

F. Respect for Individual Dignity

1. Possession of sexually exploitative material, including sexually explicit videos or use of web sites, is banned on all Crazy Horse-owned property.

2. Visitation by members of the opposite sex in the residence hall other than during scheduled visitation hours is prohibited.

G. Respect for the Property of Others

Theft, embezzlement, misappropriation, possession, or attempt to do same of property owned or maintained by Crazy Horse Memorial, by any person on the campus or by any person attending a Crazy Horse Memorial-sponsored event is prohibited.

H. Respect for the Crazy Horse Memorial Mission and Purpose

1. Off-campus conduct that directly, seriously and adversely interferes with or disrupts the educational or related functions of Crazy Horse Memorial is prohibited and may result in disciplinary sanctions.
2. Violation of any local, state, or federal law that adversely affects some distinct and clear interest of Crazy Horse Memorial and its community is prohibited.

I. Disciplinary Program for the Summer University Program of the Indian University of North America at Crazy Horse Memorial

We have certain rules of conduct that stem from our respect for individuals, federal and state laws and our emphasis on safety, honesty, integrity and consideration for the rights of others. As a member of the Summer University Program at Crazy Horse Memorial, you are expected to behave in a responsible manner on and off campus and to be courteous and respectful to your fellow students, and to members of the faculty and staff. We strongly suggest that students and parents/guardians spend time discussing why a program like ours needs *Dormitory Occupancy Rules and Rules of Conduct*, and why a participant must conform to them, even though some rules may differ from customs at home. Students should consider them carefully and be willing to comply before they send back their registration forms.

J. Disciplinary Process

This is the disciplinary process for the Summer University Program at Crazy Horse Memorial. It will be used when students do not meet the standards of the *Dormitory Occupancy Rules and the Rules of Conduct* outlined in this handbook. We hold students fully accountable for their behavior and actions on our campus as well as in our community.

Dorm Directors have the authority to discipline students for minor infractions of these rules such as being late for the nightly check-in curfew or tardy for work or class. More serious violations requiring a Formal Written Warning shall be referred to the Summer Program Disciplinary Committee. The Summer Program Discipline Committee will refer students with repeat violations of Dormitory Occupancy Rules and Rules of Conduct or violations of State or Federal Law to the Disciplinary Review Committee for dismissal. Membership on these committees shall be as follows:

- **The Disciplinary Committee** shall include a Dorm Director and the on-site Summer Program Coordinators for Crazy Horse Memorial and the University of South Dakota. The Program Coordinator for Crazy Horse Memorial shall chair this committee.
- **The Disciplinary Review Committee** shall include the Director of Development for Crazy Horse Memorial Foundation and the Dean of The Graduate School, Division of Continuing and Distance Education, University of South Dakota.

The disciplinary process that is outlined below will be enacted for any violation of regulations, ranging from not following the nightly check-in curfew procedure to alcohol and drug use, etc. The imposed sanction depends on the severity and frequency of violations of the Dormitory Occupancy Rules and Rules of Conduct or violations of State or Federal law.

1. **Verbal Warning:** Students involved in minor violations will receive a verbal warning from a Dorm Director, Crazy Horse Memorial supervisor or a University Faculty member and the warning will be documented in their Personnel File.

2. **Formal Written Warning:** Students involved in more serious violations such as the use of alcohol or drugs, harassment, not showing up for class or work, etc., will receive a verbal warning and a formal letter from the Summer University Program Disciplinary Committee stating that further

infractions of the Dormitory Occupancy Rules and Rules of Conduct will be dealt with more seriously.

3. Probation: Students with repeat violations or illegal activity may be placed on probation after a formal hearing with the Summer University Program Disciplinary Committee. Probation can include a specific time frame and restriction of certain privileges and activities such as early nightly check-in, community service, or other terms.

4. Dismissal: The Disciplinary Committee may refer Students to the Disciplinary Review Committee for dismissal from the Summer University Program if they have violated the Dormitory Occupancy Rules and/or Rules of Conduct repeatedly, have violated academic outlines, or state and federal law, and have clearly demonstrated that they are not acting responsibly toward themselves or others (whether or not their actions have been covered by specific rules). Parents/Guardians will be notified after the dismissal decision has been made.

5. Appeal of Dismissal Decision: An appeal of the decision to dismiss may be made by the student in writing to the Summer University Program Disciplinary Review Committee within 24 hours of the decision. A student who is dismissed from the Summer University Program at Crazy Horse Memorial will be required to leave campus within 24 hours of parent/guardian notification. No refund is given if student is dismissed from the program.

6. Disclosure of Disciplinary Information to Parents and Guardians: The Summer University Program will follow the FERPA guidelines on disclosure of educational and disciplinary information as follows:

- The student has provided written consent to the school to release educational and disciplinary information to the parents/guardians.
- The student is a dependent for income tax purposes.
- A health or safety emergency involves their son or daughter.
- If the student is under age 21 and has violated any law or school policy concerning use or possession of alcohol or a controlled substance.
- Information that is based on a school official's personal knowledge or observation of the student.
