EDAD 740 Rdgs & Iss for Administrators is a unique course available at NSU. The NSU course is an overview of relevant issues identified through current publications, books, and articles. Seminar approaches lead to students working together to solve relevant issues with a special focus on multicultural education and special education. The proposed EDAD 786 Superintendent Capstone course will focus on relevant school issues that are found in student's schools as well as in the literature and involve students in uncovering solutions to apply to resolve district issues.

The EDAD 790 Seminar course appears the next closest to the proposed EDAD 786 Superintendent Capstone course. The EDAD 790 Seminar course includes student presentations and discussions of reports based on literature, practices, problems, and research. The proposed Superintendent Capstone is designed to be a culminating academic experience to prepare

innovative scholar-practitioners for current critical issues with the purpose of enhancing success for all learners at the district level.
