ACCT 441/541	Forensic Auditing and Fraud Examination	3

Course Description
This course is an introduction to forensic auditing designed to detect employee asset misappropriation and fraudulent financial reporting. It examines various aspects of forensic accounting/auditing, fraud prevention and detection, including the sociology of fraud, elements of fraud, ethics, types and costs of fraud, use of internal controls to prevent fraud, and use of technology in fraud detection. This course also covers basic aspects of internal auditing and operational audits performed by internal auditors.

There is **no** "comparable **common** course [that] already exists." The above listed courses are *unique* courses offered by DSU and BHSU.

ACCT 454 (Advanced Auditing and Assurance) builds on the first auditing course and it requires ACCT 450 (auditing) as a prerequisite. Our proposed ACCT 4/541 (Forensic Auditing and Fraud Examination) is not an advanced auditing course; auditing is not a pre-requisite.

ACCT 452 (Fraud and Forensic Accounting) is an introductory course about the role of the forensic accountant. Additionally, ACCT 4/541 is different from ACCT 452 and ACCT 454 in the following additional aspects: ACCT 4/541 will teach data analytic techniques using ACL (or IDEA) software; students will learn Benford's Law; sample selection and interpretation of results; advanced analytical procedures; identification of anomalies and duplicate records; internal controls to prevent fraud; fraud examination; principles of internal auditing and operational auditing.

The first of a two sequence course, this course will provide students with a hybrid understanding of basic and clinical/therapeutic pharmacology. The basic pharmacology focus emphasizes contemporary studies of mechanisms of action and pharmacokinetics while clinical/therapeutic pharmacology emphasizes clinical indications, adverse reactions, and drug interactions. This course will cover pharmacodynamics and pharmacokinetics, and nervous system, cardiac, and renal pharmacology.
