<p>This course stresses the linkages between human, animal, and environmental health. Interdisciplinary communication and collaboration are necessary to address health issues such as zoonotic diseases. Students will have the opportunity to learn about animal health while working with veterinarians and others in the livestock industry and animal health. There will also be opportunities to explore the linkages with other stakeholders. Students will develop an educational intervention for human or animal health providers, or livestock producers.</p>
