By way of background, we have always taught PSYC 464 Theories of Personality and Psychotherapy and the high level of overlap ensured that we did not need 461 in addition. However, noting that the field usually prefers Theories of Personality rather than our combined version as their prerequisite and because Sara Lowmaster, our faculty member who teaches personality for us, prefers teaching Theories of Personality without the other content, we wish to delete our 464 course and begin to offer PSYC 461.
