The University of South Dakota Sanford School of Medicine is to provide to its students and to the people of South Dakota excellence in education, research and service. To these ends, the school is to provide educational pathways leading to both the Doctor of Medicine and the Doctor of Philosophy degrees; and quality health care for the people of South Dakota is addressed by undergraduate, graduate and continuing educational programs as well as by basic and applied medical research.

The School of Medicine should serve as a technical resource in the development of health care policy in the state and provide extension and research initiatives to improve the health care of the citizens of the state.

Teaching Locations

The Sanford School of Medicine is a community-based medical school, which means that it utilizes the facilities of hospitals and clinics throughout South Dakota for the clinical education of its students.

Economic Impact/Factors

The Sanford School of Medicine:

- last year was awarded over \$16.1 million in external research grants and contracts, which creates high-paying jobs, supports facility construction and grows the economy in many other ways.
- provides the opportunity for South Dakota students to become physicians, physician scientists and biomedical researchers.
- prepares physicians who are needed for the state's growing health care industry.
- SD HOSA: Future Health Professionals will have 1,000+ members in 35 schools across South Dakota. Seventy-two percent of the members reside in rural communities with 13% having diverse backgrounds.
- Frontier And Rural Medicine program places 10 students at 7 rural sites. Since its inception in 2014, 60% of the graduates have matched in Primary Care residency programs. FARM will grow to 11 students with the Class of 2023.
- SD AHEC has grown to three regional centers and a program office with a current budget of over \$1 million.
- sponsors or affiliates with eight residency and four fellowship programs, which have an annual impact of more than \$15.3 million.

The School of Health Sciences also has a profound economic impact with over 2,000 students majoring in undergraduate and graduate health sciences programs in the following departments: Addiction Counseling and Prevention, Dental Hygiene, Health Sciences, Medical Laboratory Science, Nursing, Occupational Therapy, Physician Assistant Studies, Physical Therapy, Public Health and Social Work. Last year, over 500 students graduated with degrees from the School of Health Sciences. Additionally, the school has two centers - the Center for the Prevention of Child Maltreatment (CPCM) and the Interprofessional Health Education Center (IHEC) To learn more, visit www.usd.edu/health.

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M.D. Program

The current enrollment of the Sanford School of Medicine (SSOM) entering class is 71 students. Students spend their first three semesters in Vermillion taking classes in basic biomedical sciences. Next they receive five semesters of clinical training in Rapid City, Sioux Falls or Yankton. About 50 percent of each class goes to Sioux Falls with the other students split between the Rapid City and Yankton campuses, with ten of the students spending two semesters in the Frontier And Rural Medicine (FARM) program.
